



## Dress Code 2007

### 1. Outline

1.1. This is a WADL policy governing the standard of dress of WADL adjudicators. This policy is to be read in conjunction with the Policy on Regulation of Adjudication 2007.

### 2. Acceptable and unacceptable dress

2.1. When acting as an adjudicator or head adjudicator at a WADL venue, adjudicators are required to use their discretion and dress in a manner which is appropriate, taking account of the fact that:

- (i) they are providing paid, professional services, and
- (ii) they are representing WADL.

2.2. For men, appropriate clothing *at a minimum* consists of:

- (i) collared shirts
- (ii) long pants, and
- (iii) closed shoes.

2.3. For women, appropriate clothing *at a minimum* consists of:

- (i) smart casual tops, and
- (ii) either long pants or skirts past the knee.

2.4. Both men and women must not wear the following:

- (i) thongs
- (ii) torn clothing
- (iii) tracksuit pants or tops, or
- (iv) stained and unclean clothing.

### 3. Breach

3.1. Breach of this Dress Code constitutes a Category C Breach for the purposes of the WADL Policy on Regulation of Adjudication 2007.

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
